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## **Analysis of the Impact of Globalization Trends in the Digital Economy on Business Management and Administration Systems of Enterprises**

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**Abstract.** This study aims to investigate the impact of globalization trends on the business management and administration systems. The scoping review of the literature included 123 articles through desk research and in-house material. Upon categorizing typologies as qualitative, quantitative, or mixed, an assessment was made regarding the performance and consequences of globalization from 1990 to 2022. Developing country managers are more likely to depend on international sales as a means to augment revenue, due to the greater saturation of sales in developed markets. Developed economies focus on advanced, possibly automated production methods, whereas developing nations employ the digital economy to compete in less automated industries. This creates a more specialized global market. E-commerce in the digital economy makes it easier for developing nations to enter the global market and reach a global audience. In their pursuit of financial gain, corporations based in affluent nations are more likely to employ sophisticated production methods, while those situated in developing countries are more likely to utilize less advanced ones. A number of prevalent issues and trends—including economics, politics, emerging markets, corporate social responsibility, and emerging markets—were recognized as critical for the development of global markets. While past research has focused on globalization's effects on developed economies, this study examines emerging country managers' unique difficulties and opportunities. The emphasis on expanding international sales and potential manufacturing process reduction can inform management approaches in similar situations. The recommendations underscore the critical necessity for further investigation into the aforementioned impacts across diverse economies, ranging from developing to developed. Although this study encountered difficulties due to inconsistent and limited data, it established a strong foundation for subsequent investigations in the field through the application of operationalization, methodologies, and analyses discovered in the business literature.

## Introduction

Globalization refers to the widespread interconnection and distribution of technology, production, and communication across the globe (Fan, 2024). A recent study indicates that there has been a significant disruption in the global landscape of business management during the previous few decades (Gölgeci et al., 2023). Numerous challenges have emerged in the realm of global commerce over the course of history. These issues have arisen due to heightened economic volatility and escalating trade tensions (Han et al., 2024). Based on the world trade organization (WTO) estimates, it is expected that global commerce will grow by approximately 7.2% in 2024 (World Trade Organization - Global trade, n.d.). The amalgamation of businesses, alliances, and well strategized partnerships have all played a role in driving this growth fueled by these causes. Globalization has led to substantial changes in several business management practices. These changes can be observed in the approaches that companies such as Amazon and Alphabet have adopted. These enterprises have experienced a significant transformation, becoming highly efficient and productive entities that may now rival the power and authority of smaller states. Amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, it is clear that technology-driven firms have thrived, generating substantial profits and establishing a commanding presence in the communication industry (Madhok, 2021). Rival companies should focus on enhancing their pricing strategies and cost-effectiveness to attain their ultimate goal of establishing themselves as the frontrunners in their respective sectors. An essential component of the modernization process involves examining the impact of globalization on multinational corporations and their capacity to adjust to shifts in market trends. The relationship between globalization characteristics and enterprise success raises important questions about corporate innovation, as well as the potential consequences of these factors (Prelipcean & Ungureanu, 2023).

Economies often acquire patents for information related to businesses within their own territories (Audretsch et al., 2019). This strategic decision has been made to safeguard their brand and uphold the standards of both their domestic and international markets. Large organizations often experience anxiety due to the disclosure of unethical business activities and the exposing of important private information by their competitors (Gawer, 2022). The growth of international trade has resulted in the identification of new markets, and the establishment of global market dominance has occurred as a result of the increasing flow of goods and services facilitated by international trade. The phenomenon of economic globalization has led to a substantial rise in collaboration and cooperation among developers from various industries worldwide (van der Loos et al., 2022). A comprehensive comprehension of the importance of efficiency, effectiveness, and predictability is crucial for the successful administration of a corporation. By prioritizing the aforementioned components, businesses can surpass their competitors and experience substantial market expansion. Furthermore, the fierce competition present in the industry poses extra obstacles for numerous global corporations. These obstacles encompass ecological concerns and negative public reactions, both of which can impact the market success of these firms (Karim et al., 2023).

### ***Research Problem***

Globalization is something that has been going on for a long time. There have been discussions about the possible effects that changes in operational processes could have on jobs and the decrease in personal interaction that could happen in social institutions (Aharoni, 2024). However, there are substantial issues that exert a profound impact on organizations worldwide. These challenges encompass the widening gaps in economic success, dependence on global markets, compromised ecological sustainability, heightened vulnerability to trade wars, and the potential fluctuations in currency exchange rates.

The convenience of conducting business overseas makes enterprises more dependent on global marketplaces for sales and even manufacturing in the digital economy. This dependency makes one exposed to various market changes, including, growing economic gaps across countries may effect consumer demand and spending. Political unrest and trade conflicts can affect supply networks and international trade. Exchange rates affect a company's profitability and international competitiveness.

Numerous studies examine the repercussions of globalization. These studies explore the broader societal consequences of globalization and its effects on the structure of organizations, going beyond its influence on business administration (Guedhami et al., 2022; Kyove et al., 2021; Petricevic & Teece, 2019; Scherer et al., 2014; Thurik et al., 2024). In the present era of worldwide interconnectivity, it is crucial to possess a comprehensive comprehension of the impacts brought about by globalization. This pertains to a diverse range of individuals and organizations who have a significant stake or involvement in a certain subject. Business organizations, government bodies, clients, and academics are all instances of entities and collectives. By sharing this information, businesses can gain substantial advantages, such as increased transparency, easier implementation of successful strategies and tactics to foster corporate growth and market competitiveness, and broader stakeholder awareness beyond the industry.

### ***Research Focus***

The study has focused on the factors of business management and system administration and how these factors has been affected by globalization trends in the timeframe of digital economy.

### ***Research Aim***

To investigate how globalization trends of the digital economy impact business management and administration systems in multinational corporations.

## **Research Questions**

How have globalization trends in the digital economy affected the way organizations manage their businesses?

What are the key challenges and opportunities that arise for business corporations due to the combined effects of globalization and the digital economy on their business management and administration systems?

Section two the study consists of literature review. In section three, materials and methodology are detailed. Section four present results and their discussion. Lastly, section five represents the conclusion of the study.

## **Literature review**

Many researchers like (Bratu, 2022; Cambalikova, 2021; Van Loo, 2019; Frederick & Zhang, 2024; Hong et al., 2023; Kim et al., 2020; Yusufu & Patrick, 2019) considered the globalization and business management to explore the consequences on the digital era. Following is the detail of previous literature.

Li et al. (2018) explored multinational companies of the European Union are investing in developing economies. The reason behind these business activities in developing nations is take an advantages of environmental safety laws and rules that are mandatory to follow in host nations

Consequently, they can reap financial rewards by capitalizing on this situation. International firms are free to set their own operational norms in China because of the country's very flexible climate change regulatory environment. When it comes to this specific aspect, China serves as an interesting example. However, less effective solutions are often the result because these organizations hesitate to take responsibility. However, wherever they come from, there is a resounding commitment to combating climate change and an abundance of support for initiatives that promote accountability and sustainability. Their dedication to preventative measures is evident in this. There is much debate over how globalization has affected business management, with both sides presenting strong arguments.

Bilan (2019) found that more and more people are involved in the concept of globalization, especially in the corporate world. All of these companies have grown tremendously and gone global since they first opened their doors. Critics of market interdependence argue that it could lead to the downfall of an economy that strives for progress and equality, hence they stress the importance of thorough research and care.

Vorontsova et al. (2019) explored that protesters passionately fought for a variety of issues during annual meeting of World Trade Organization (WTO) in 1999. A wide range of civil society groups, NGOs, and causes including labor rights, environmental protection, religious liberty, student rights, and consumer protection were involved. Some have argued that these events caused people to rebel against globalization. Concerned about free trade and the detrimental effects of globalization on human rights, the NGOs expressed their discontent with the WTO's policies. Erokhin (2020) studied that the economics of emerging nations across many continents are still very much divided on the impact of global capitalism's ascent. The challenges associated with stereotypes, political decision-making, national pride, and the development of managerial identities are exacerbated by these factors within the context of expanding global strategy. It is important to highlight that these issues are no longer significant in the business industry of developed countries. Business management in both developed and emerging economies face challenges related to the responsibility of foreigners. These concerns arise from various factors, such as the heightened operational risks and costs associated with geographically dispersed businesses, the unpredictable political situations in host countries of multinational corporations, the fluctuating currency exchange rates, and the economic instability. Tax avoidance is a contentious topic that involves businesses transferring their profits to jurisdictions with lower tax rates.

As profit shifting becomes increasingly prevalent, many governments have enacted legislation on foreign taxation to combat this practice.

Flew (2020) evaluated that advocates of globalization contend that the real problem is not the rapid increase of globalization, but rather its absence. Some individuals hold the belief that globalization offers remedies to the issues that humanity has caused worldwide, while also offering a thorough examination of these concerns. Globalization has greatly influenced the removal of national borders, customs, and other barriers that hinder multinational companies. As a result, it has become a key principle in the contemporary global corporate sphere. Hence, the assertion that globalization exerts a substantial influence on various dimensions of the worldwide environment, including the corporate, ethical, political, cultural, and economic domains, is indeed credible. This phenomenon has a significant impact on various industries, such as business and others.

Anand et al. (2021) explored that the presence of multinational firms is a significant factor that contributes to the interdependence of economies. They can make and utilized connections between the economies of other nations due to their proficiency in economics, which in turn enhances their ability to operate effectively across borders and stimulates the development of a unified market. The worldwide market has become more open and competitive due to the emergence of a larger number of market participants.

Firmansyah et al. (2021) it is crucial to consider the following seven fundamental challenges: human rights, environmental concerns, equitable operating methods, organizational governance, labour practices, community involvement and development, and consumer protection. The enforcement of these regulations has a beneficial effect on economies undergoing expansion as they aid in diminishing pollution levels, enhancing labour remuneration, and fostering additional prospects for workers to enhance their skills. If domestic companies also embrace the same principles, it is likely that they will experience similar positive effects of globalization. This would lead to an enhancement in the efficacy of corporate social responsibility (CSR) when compared to multinational corporations.

Qamruzzaman (2022) argued that the institutional development and market friendliness of the host nation contribute to the advantages of foreign direct investment (FDI). This has been accomplished for a multitude of reasons pertaining to effectiveness. Creating business networks that promote the creation of new business output and the revitalization of existing business operations is a strategy that can greatly enhance efficiency for individuals with a strong grasp of economics.

It is crucial for governments hosting the event to actively support and promote the continuous facilitation of innovations within the domestic market system. Furthermore, it is crucial for nations to implement legislation and adopt other strategies to deter FDI from relocating domestic businesses from their present positions. As the economy grows and business conditions become more competitive, smart business executives will have the chance to expand their operations globally.

Siyal et al. (2022) investigated that corporate social responsibility (CSR) is vital for business community to survive in the wave of globalization. Business companies have a significant role in promoting CSR by establishing objectives and standards for the organizations with whom they collaborate. Business firms have a considerable influence on the diffusion of these certifications in nations that are considered to be undeveloped. A key impact that climate change has on the global expansion of multinational corporations is the changing climate. It is anticipated that these companies would conduct research investigations into the potential impacts that climate change may have on their operations.

Zheng et al. (2023) found that corporations have a significant impact on the development of globalization. The diverse actions they have implemented, such as mergers, strategic alliances, and acquisitions, to enable their growth into new markets exemplify this fact. Globalization exerts a significant impact on multinational organizations worldwide, yielding both beneficial and bad

consequences. The distinct attributes of an organization's operations have a significant impact on the outcomes of those activities. Upon examination of the matter, it becomes clear that the interconnectedness of economies is of great importance in organizational management, particularly when evaluating possible losses for individual enterprises.

Benabed and Grünbichler (2023) evaluated the various challenges in Globalization process. This has created an environment for company leaders to seize on rapidly rising market prospects. Much research was done to investigate the complex relationships between globalization and production, marketing, and consumption. This highlighted the importance of corporate management in improving operational efficiency and social responsibility. Businesses' worldwide expansion and focus depend on their geographical breadth. Several recent studies have raised questions about how globalization has affected local economies and industry. Globalization opponents claim that the wide variety of products and markets might increase costs and insufficient management for large enterprises, resulting in a loss in performance.

Murphy (2024) investigated that how a person may gain and how multinational organizations are influenced by the dynamics of globalization by acquiring a thorough knowledge of the global economy. These organizations must do a rigorous analysis of their productivity performance by assessing their procedures, technologies, and general knowledge of their operations. By doing comprehensive research and development, organizations can gain a large amount of knowledge that can be exploited to enhance production. This can be achieved by embracing cutting-edge technical breakthroughs, enhancing operating procedures, providing unique and unsurpassed products and services, and eventually reducing pricing. However, corporate organizations often face hurdles in deterring other entities from engaging in intellectual property theft. In this industry, the impact of legislation can sometimes be constrained, especially in conditions where copyright rules are lightly enforced or nonexistent. Due to the trend of globalization, organizations that are involved in fierce rivalry today have the potential to apply a range of strategies. These strategies include acquiring patents, recruiting individuals from competing companies, reverse engineering competitors' products, obtaining components at lower costs, and forming alliances with other businesses. Although it is crucial for economic progress to comprehend the geographic dispersion, diffusion, and advancement of technology, there remains a significant amount of knowledge to be acquired in this domain.

Usman et al. (2024) highlighted the presence of development disparities between the performance of a domestic country and the strategy, identity, and practices of a foreign country. This is a factor that should be considered. This phenomenon may be attributed to the conflicting interests of the global parent company and its various local stakeholders. However, business corporations and emerging company executives in developing countries have collaborated through international joint ventures (IJVs), leading to significant advantages for local businesses in terms of knowledge and technology transfer. Nevertheless, there are reports indicating that the technology transfer from international joint ventures (IJVs) may result in local businesses becoming excessively reliant on their foreign partners, thereby impeding their capacity to prosper.

## **Materials and Methods**

### ***General Background***

Desk research and internal resources are utilised to provide an analysis of the effects that globalisation has had on multinational corporations from 1990 to 2022. A systematic scoping literature analysis was carried out by making use of a number of electronic journal databases. The purpose of this study was to thoroughly examine, select, and compile the existing knowledge and abilities in the industry.

## ***Study Design***

Utilising a scoping literature review approach, the study outlines significant concepts, evidence categories, and research requirements by combining exploratory keywords. This is accomplished through the study's design. This underscores the importance of concentrating on both identifying the information that already exists and pursuing new research possibilities in the field of globalisation and multinational corporations.

## ***Interventions/Variables***

Papers that were published after 1990<sup>1</sup> and had been subjected to peer review and had a registered DOI were rigorously investigated for this study. The typologies of research were classified as qualitative, quantitative, or mixed, with a particular emphasis placed on the "direct" effects that globalisation has had on multinational corporations.

## ***Data Collection***

More than three thousand articles, reviews, and unpublished material were located through an exhaustive search that was carried out for the purpose of data collection. Following this, the data were narrowed to identify 123 scientific publications that were published after the year 1990 and had a DOI that was registered with the University of Michigan.

## ***Data Analysis***

The number of articles released each year has been steadily climbing during the past few years. An assessment method revealed that the number of articles published began to rise sharply after 1990.

With a focus on the effects of globalization and multinational corporations, a comprehensive study was carried out to investigate the geographical distribution of countries of origin and destinations. Three major takeaways emerged from the literature assessment on globalization. The report shed light on the pros and cons of globalization for businesses, which is a great resource. Furthermore, the report provided insightful analysis of the worldwide market and how it operates. Table 1 gives a synopsis of the effects of globalization on management in corporations, looking at nine countries that are often considered both host and home. The effect of globalization on company performance has been the subject of an extensive investigation. This research has been based on extensive worldwide evaluations. The proliferation of multinational corporations has resulted in an increase in the number of research discoveries that have been discovered in both the home country and the host country as a result of the process of globalization. In addition, it was anticipated that the bulk of the home nations would be situated in the developed world due to the robustness of their economies, whereas only a small proportion of the host nations would be from emerging economies. To illustrate the significant economic influence that these regions have, the United States of America, China, the United Kingdom, Germany, and France had the highest number of students living in their respective countries. There is a connection

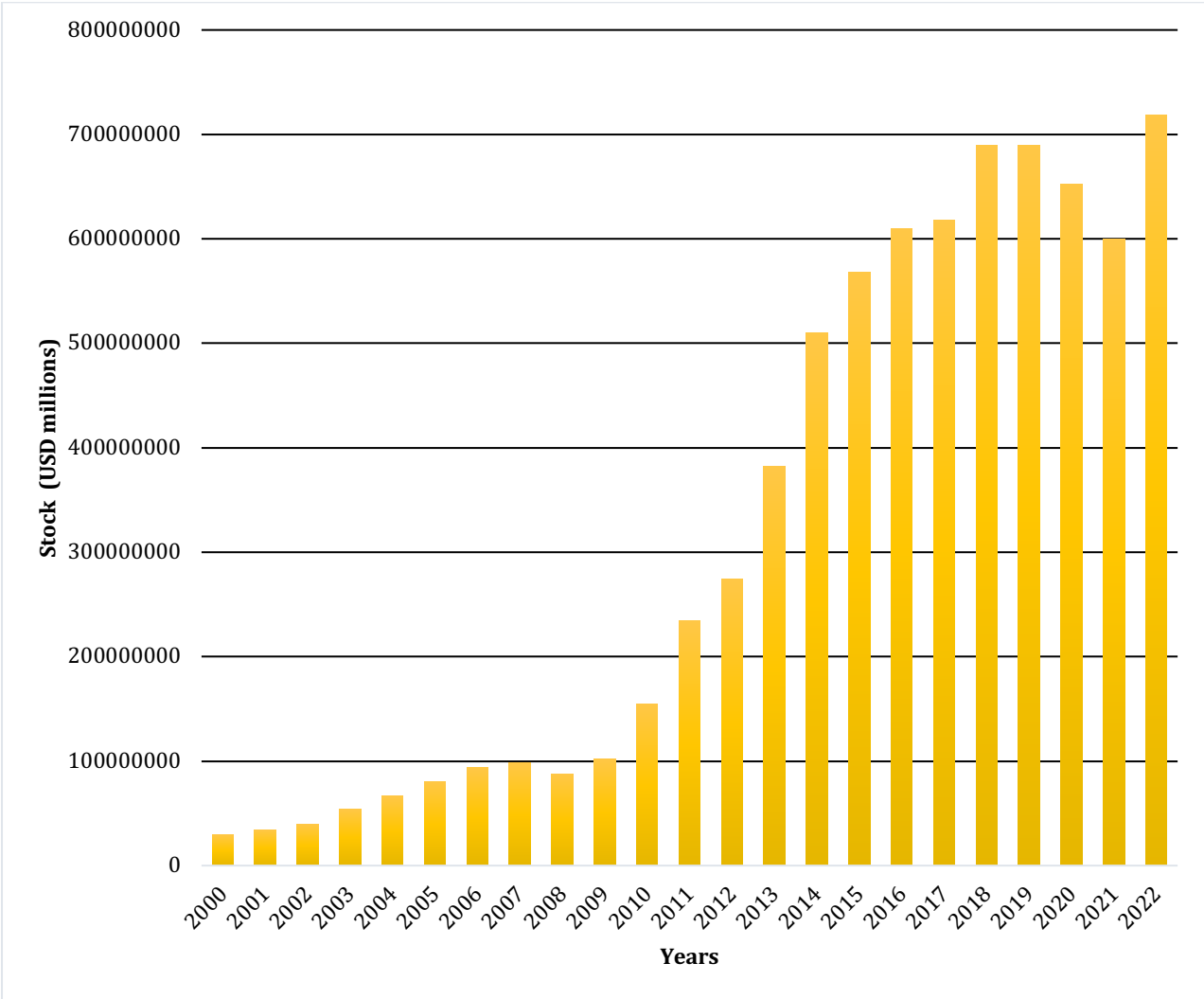

There has been a rise in productivity all around the world as a result of the effects of globalization and the interconnections between productivity, international trade, and direct investment from overseas. Regardless of the trials postured by the COVID-19 pandemic, it is anticipated that global trade would increase by approximately fifty percent in the year 2021, drawing in multinational corporations from a variety of countries. This is based on past patterns and growth rates. These results are in line with Albertoni and Wise (2021) and Headrick (2022). FDI index around the world had a significant jump in the year 2000, with an increase that was over twofold same like the findings of Martínez-Galán and Fontoura (2019) and (Puzikova, 2023).

*A visual representation of the worldwide patterns in FDI from 2000 to 2022*



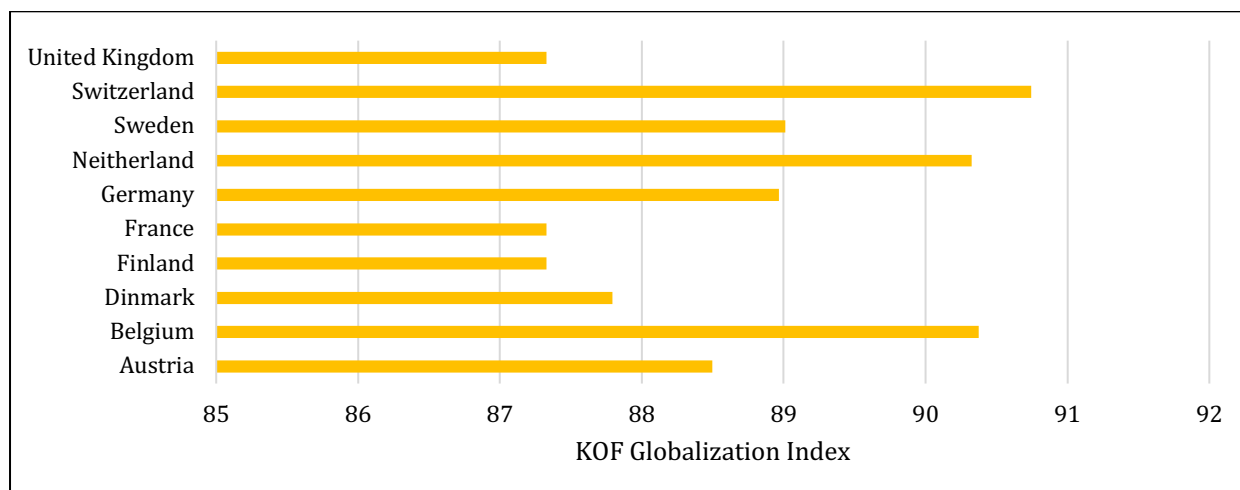

The existing economic streams, constraints, and information data are all taken into consideration in order to accomplish this goal. Figure 2 identify the nations that are anticipated to acquire the highest positions on the globalization index by the year 2021. The worldwide Economic Dynamics Report reveals a noteworthy pattern that has been seen from the year 1990, which is that an increasing number of businesses have spread their operations around the globe. There has been an increase in the average annual growth in real gross domestic product per capita in both developing nations and industrialized nations as a result of the expansion.

## **Discussion**

A robust and beneficial association between worldwide expansion and financial success for these businesses has been consistently established by comprehensive studies that have been conducted on companies all over the world. These studies have included both developed nations and emerging economies across the globe. The growth of global operations has the potential to increase overall performance, as indicated by the findings of research. Different global assessments and alternative performance indicators were shown to have a variety of effects, and the findings demonstrated that these effects varied depending on the sampling. Despite having lower levels of globalization indicators such as overseas sales, foreign assets, and foreign personnel, businesses in developing nations showed bigger gains in both their net income and their sales. This was the case even though these businesses were compared to businesses all around the world. The fact that these firms, in contrast to well-established businesses in developed nations, are currently engaged in expansion and experiencing tremendous growth is one of the factors that contributes to this phenomenon. Over the course of the industrialized nations' history, businesses have been presented with several opportunities to expand their sources of income, capital investments, and manpower on a worldwide scale. Because of this, they often display higher levels of globalization than other countries. There is a discernible connection between the coefficients and statistical significance of the variables for international sales and foreign employees in the models of emerging nations, which lends weight to the findings that Sukrat and Leeraphong (2024) have drawn. Consequently, indicators pertaining to foreign assets are considered to be of less significance. The firms of developing countries are primarily dependent on the generation of revenue and the expansion of their personnel in order to improve their international profitability. This is mostly due to the limited financial resources that these countries possess. There is a possibility that these two are related to one another. It was shown that the alignment of the variables exhibited significant heterogeneity in the models of industrialized countries, despite the fact that all of the variables demonstrated statistical significance. Other studies like Rundh (2023) and Seyfi et al. (2023) also found the same results. The relevance of corporate management devoting priority to sales in abroad markets in order to raise income is brought into focus by this phenomenon. Businesses in prosperous nations often make use of more sophisticated forms of production in order to generate income, but businesses in less developed nations may occasionally rely on forms that are less sophisticated.

## **Conclusion**

In order to explore the impact that globalization has had on the performance of multinational firms, a study was conducted on papers that were published in prestigious journals between the years 1990 and the current day. It is increasingly important for businesses to prepare an international business strategy as a result of the huge rise in the amount of trade that occurs both globally and between regions. In the course of the literature research, a number of significant topics and elements were discussed. Research might examine how multinational firms in developing nations adopt corporate social responsibility (CSR) and its implications on the local economy and community. How governments in developing nations might use globalization to promote ethical and sustainable economic practices is also worth investigating.

This analysis's data accessibility limits highlight the need for more extensive data collecting in future investigations. We can use larger and more diverse sample sizes, big data analytics, and

qualitative and quantitative methods to better understand how globalization affects corporate management systems.

Due to globalization's constant change, research must be done constantly. Technological advances, artificial intelligence, and regional trade blocs can be studied further. Scholars who understand globalization's continual change can help corporations and policymakers navigate this complex environment.

Following these study guidelines will help us understand the complicated effects of globalization on business management systems worldwide. This information is essential for global business success and ethical and sustainable economic development.

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
